architect. He was the naval architect for seven America's Cup
campaigns. His firm was responsible for hundreds of designs that were
frequently breakthroughs in yachting and influenced the direction of
naval architecture worldwide. Farr was a gifted sailor who studied how
to make boats sail fast. He spent his career at the leading edge of the
sport.
Locally, Bruce is an active member of TVMYS where he selflessly helps all
sailors with their radio-controlled boats.
